**What does the fund invest in?**

The fund's investment objective is to produce a stable rate of return and long-term capital appreciation by investing primarily in a diversified mix of mutual funds (which may include exchange-traded funds) in order to have access to equity securities and fixed income securities, whether Canadian or foreign.

### How risky is it?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money. One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility". In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

### Risk Rating

RGP Investments has rated the volatility of this fund as **Low to Medium**.

This rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

### No Guarantees

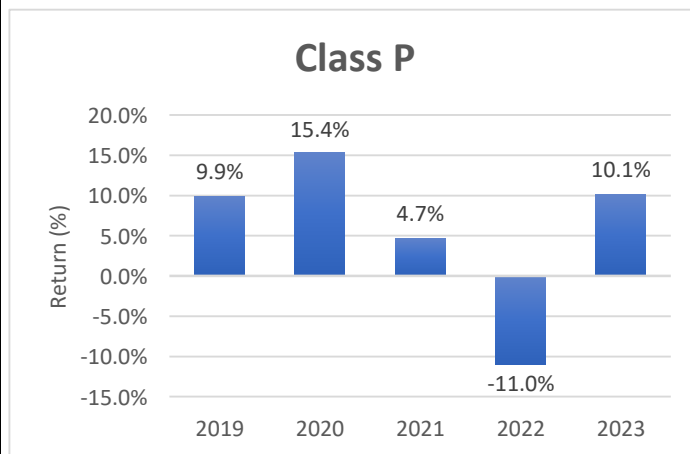
Like most mutual funds, this fund does not have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

### How has the fund performed?

This section tells you how class P units of the fund have performed over the past five years. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the class' returns.

#### Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how class P units of the fund performed in the past five years. The fund dropped in value during one of these years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the fund will perform in the future.



### Best and worst three-month returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for the class P units of the fund in a 3-month period over the past five years. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

### Average return

The annual compounded rate of return of class P units of the fund was 5.4% since its inception. If you had invested \$1,000 in this class since inception, your investment would now be worth \$1,323.90.

### Who is this fund for?

- You are prepared to accept low to medium risk;
- You are looking for a medium-term or long-term investment;
- You want an investment solution that lets you invest in a broad set of securities in order to build a globally diversified portfolio.

### A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

### How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell class P units of the fund. The fees and expenses – including commissions – can vary among classes of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

#### 1. Sales charges

You pay no sales or redemption charges when you buy, redeem or switch class P units of the fund. Your representative's firm may charge a fee for additional services. You must negotiate these fees with your representative's firm. Such fees are not paid to the fund or its manager.

#### 2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund's returns.

As of December 31, 2023, the fund's expenses were 0.42% of its value. This equals \$4.20 for every \$1,000 invested.

#### More about the trailing commission

There is no trailing commission for class P units of the fund.

#### 3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch units of the fund.

Fees	What you pay
<b>Switch Fee</b>	There are no charges if you switch or transfer your units.
<b>Short-term Trading Fee</b>	Up to 2% of the amount that you redeem or switch if you buy or switch and then redeem or switch class P units of the fund within 90 days of purchasing or switching them. This penalty will be paid directly to the fund.
<b>Professional Services Fee</b>	Class P units are mainly offered to investors that have a managed account with RGP Investments. In those situation, RGP Investments charge a fee for professional services in its capacity as portfolio manager to investor that have a managed account with us (as such term is defined in Regulation 31-103 – Registration Requirements, Exemptions and Ongoing Registrants Obligations. This fee is determined between you and RGP Investments and is based on the total market value of the assets in your managed account, including class P units. This fee covers ongoing professional services related to your managed account, such as determining and maintaining your investment objectives, risk tolerance, time horizon and expected returns. This fee is not part of the MER. Class P units may, and in a limited number of circumstances preapproved by RGP Investments, be offered to investors who have a fee-based account or wrap program with an authorised representative's firm. In those situation, Professional Service Fees are determined between you and your representative and are payable to your representative's firm. They are generally based on the market value of the assets you have with your representative's firm.
<b>Additional Services</b>	Your representative's firm may charge a fee for additional services. Certain of these fees are negotiable while others may not be. Such fees are not paid to RGP Investments. For example, a fee may be charged to you for each cash distribution you request by cheque (such fee being generally not negotiable).

**What if I change my mind?**

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or a fund facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, fund facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
